III. Standing Committee Reports

1. Finance (S. Grubacic)

a. AAUP Full-time: \$ 92,058.59 b. AAUP Part-time: \$ 2,147.45

- i. Concern was raised again since faculty had received an email stating the parttime funds had been exhausted.
- c. Creative Activity: No report
- 2. Personnel Policy (M. Shea)
 - a. Committee worked on the faculty opinion survey of administrative effectiveness.
- 3. Rules (R. Gregory)
 - a. Committee worked on roles of a parliamentarian and webmaster for inclusion in the bylaws.
- 4. Student Policy (M. Nizhnikov)
 - a. Committee drafted two resolutions that will be presented at the next meeting. One concerns removing the "A+" as a possible grade; the second is to remove "WF/WP" when a student withdraws and replace with just "W."
- 5. Technology (W. Stutzman)
 - a. Alerts senators that IT is rolling out an additional layer of security. Information concerning this change will be sent out by email soon and it will be important that faculty are familiar with these changes.
 - b. The results of the survey on Learning Management Software (LMS) will be made available soon.
 - c. A computer replacement policy for faculty has been drafted. The committee will request to meet with stakeholders to finalize it.
 - d. A workaround for people experiencing keychain issues with Mac computers will soon be available.
- 6. Academic Policy (D. Pettigrew)
 - a. Committee has researched policies on awarding posthumous degrees. Common practice indicates that a student is awarded either a degree or a certificate depending on the percentage of completed credits at time of passing.
 - i. After discussion, Senators felt that a threshold of at least 75% credit completion warranted awarding the degree; below that level of completion, a student would be awarded a certificate.
- 7. Elections (K. Kurzcek)
 - a. Electronic voting should be in place for the next round of All-University elections.

V. Special Committees

- 1. UCF (C. Simoneau)
 - a. UCF has moved forward with the articulation agreement with Tunxis Community College.
 - b. On March 4, 2019, 1-1:50 in Engleman C112 there will be a forum on the School curriculum committee issue.
 - c. Interdisciplinary guidelines are being discussed and will be brought back to the Senate soon.
 - d. The UCF Constitution was distributed for approval to all Senators.
 - i. J. Dunklee moved to approve the UCF constitution as distributed. Seconded.
 - ii. Motion was approved.
- 2. Graduate Council (J. Gregory)
 - a. Committee stressed that everyone has a role to play in graduate enrollment, and committee is seeking ideas for internal and external efforts.
 - b. In addition to the traditional open house in April, they will be transitioning to different, more targeted models.
- 3. FASP (D. Pettigrew)
 - a. Committee is working on making the academic strategic plan more visible and relevant to our daily lives and operation.
 - b. During community hour on April 8, 2019, a forum will take place, taking into account a previously distributed survey asking for participants to identify priorities within the plan.
