Sociology, B.A. Courses provide both broad and in-depth encounters with sociology as a discipline. They help students develop an understanding of social behavior, social structures, and how people come to understand their experiences.

Sociology, B.S. – *Concentration: Criminology and Criminal Justice* | This program focuses on Criminology with a social science foundation and an emphasis on diversity. Elective offerings allow students to adapt the major to their interests and career plans.

Minor in Criminal Justice | This interdisciplinary 18-credit minor introduces the field of criminal justice and prepares students for a variety of positions in law enforcement, the judicial systems, correctional institutions, social work, and counseling. This minor is sponsored jointly by the History, Political Science, Psychology, and Sociology departments.

Minor in Ethnic Studies | The minor in Ethnic Studies provides an opportunity for students to take a group of courses that address the impact of race, culture, class, gender, and sexuality in shaping institutions, social relations, and identities.

Minor in Sociology | The minor in Sociology provides a flexible introduction to topics in Sociology. Students take Introduction to Sociology and five additional electives in the discipline.
