The BS program prepares students for entry-level professional social work positions and for advancement to graduate social work education.

BS students gain important experience in their field practicum, the cornerstone of a social work education, which consists of a year-long, 400-hour on-site internship.

The BSW degree is a gateway to professional positions in an array of health and human services settings. There's a real need for social work professionals: According to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, "employment of community and social service occupations is projected to grow 11 percent from now to 2028, faster than the average for all occupations."

Social workers work in a variety of settings, including mental health clinics, schools, child welfare and human service agencies, hospitals and nursing homes, community-based organizations, and private practices. They generally work full time and may need to work evenings, weekends, and holidays.
